I need to ask you to do me a very important, brief, and timely favor. I have just completed revising the scripts for a forty segment telecourse titled Science Without Walls: Science in Your World, to air on Channel 9 starting Fall Quarter, 1996 and thereafter. This is a liberal education course designed for two major audiences:

1) Undergraduate students who are non-science majors, interested in an integrated introduction to science and technology with connection and relevance to their own majors and to their everyday lives;

2) The general television viewing audience. The objective is to interest them in scientific and technological topics and issues, to encourage and motivate them to take additional science courses, and to empower them with the background and interest to function as responsible citizens in dealing with socio-political issues.

One goal is to connect and relate the key concepts, themes, methods, and processes of science to the everyday routine existence of the typical undergraduate student and general listener who may think they are disinterested in the subject.


