Summary:

Measurement and Medicine(MM): Normal and Abnormal You! is a completely new approach to "science" education. Using personal health and medicine as the key motivator, the course involves the students in a range of activities, concepts, and subjects which span much of modern science and biomedical engineering. The first semester focuses on measurement of personal physiology - addressing what is "normall"? The second semester applies the measurement and observation skills to abnormality - to pathology - with the goal of return to health (to normality). Since much of basic physics and chemistry was derived from basic studies in anatomy and physiology, the courses both derive and utilize the key principles and concepts of physics, chemistry, and biology in a relevant, personal way. The content builds on a solid, integrated science experience, such as the Science Without Walls: Science in Your World course.

MM is designed as a two semester telecourse with thirty intense one hour weekly telecasts and includes a personal laboratory (the Labless Lab) and a tutored "real" laboratory, conducted by qualified laboratory instructors at remote locations. The laboratory instructors will be specially trained and will use a unique Briefcase Lab, developed during the project. Although the content is delivered primarily via telecasts and Internet technologies, the hands on laboratory experiments are real, involving real people in real laboratory environments.

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
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
