

The Leonardo on Wheels—Science

A Brief History

1995

Leonardo on Wheels (l) premieres at the Utah Arts Festival. The exhibits act as the outreach program of the Utah Science Center and are made possible by a grant from the Ashton Family Foundation.

1998

Leonardo on Wheels (l) transfers to the Utah State University Extension. The program focuses on elementary school students and changes its name to Discovery on Wheels.

2004

The program returns to the Utah Science Center and changes its name to The Leonardo on Wheels—Science. EnviroCare Utah and the Utah State Office of Education provide primary sponsorship and the focus of the program is redirected to middle and junior high school students.

2007

The Leonardo on Wheels—Science welcomes Battelle and L-3 Communications: Communication Systems-West as its primary sponsors.

2008

The program joins the Informal Science Education Enhancement (ISEE) partnership with the Utah State Office of Education. Rockwell Collins becomes the primary program sponsor.

2009

The Leonardo on Wheels—Science completes five years on the road, now serving 30 schools and 12,000 students per year.

The Utah Science Center merges with The Leonardo. The Leonardo on Wheels—Science becomes The Leonardo's key science outreach program.
